

## **CMTN Annual Report - Public Interest Disclosure Act**

September 1, 2025

The <u>Public Interest Disclosure Act (PIDA)</u> is BC legislation that provides a framework for employees to report specific kinds of serious wrongdoing with legislated protection from reprisal. PIDA is effective for employees of government ministries as of December 1, 2019.

Coast Mountain College (CMTN) became compliant under PIDA effective June 1, 2024.

Under section 38 (1) of PIDA, CMTN is responsible for reporting annually, all disclosures of wrongdoing made, including disclosures made to the Ombudsperson about CMTN that we have been notified of by the time of this report.

In this reporting period, the Ombudsperson did not notify us of a disclosure that it was proceeding to investigate.
