



## EC.14.44.2 > LPAT 106-New Course-Tanya Rexin (CPAC)

LPAT 106 is a 15-hour new course, created to help prepare students to write the written driver's test (learners permit.) It is geared towards low-literacy, barrier students. It was piloted through ASE and CCP and received feedback from students. It will run through the ASE and upgrading programs, rather than continuing education. The offerings will be based on funding. The Haida Gwaii school district has approached the College and is interested in having it offered there.

### EC.14.44.3 > ENTR 150, 151 & 152-New Courses-Dave McKeever (CPAC)


The three new courses ENTR 150, 151 and 152 will be part of a new Business Administration Program entrepreneurship certificate, with a Pacific Northwestern focus. The new program still needs to be presented and reviewed at CPAC. These courses (and new certificate) have been in development for over a year, in consultation with the community-based business development companies and the local school district. ENTR 150, 151 and 152 will supplement what is being taught at the High School and work is being done to give some prior learning credit to students. It was piloted in Prince Rupert, but can be applied elsewhere.



UC

- The cluster met last week and had an active meeting. Three motions were passed and also moved the articulation of two new courses. One of the motions was regarding program development in Smithers for a new program to be offered in the Eastern region. Smithers is working with the Morricetown band on this. The second motion was regarding the development of a promotion strategy. The third motion was to initiate a closer working relationship with UNBC for joint planning. The two new courses for articulation are a First Nations Studies course (Judy Thompson) and a Math course which will be in conjunction with two campuses, Terrace and Prince Rupert.

### **CCP**

The cluster will meet on December 12<sup>th</sup>. CCP is continuing the time-consuming work of identifying courses for PLAs, and once outlines and outcomes are created, they will be available to students in hopes of recognizing prior learning. CCP is working with students for feedback and the school districts for possible courses outside of scheduled school times to be used for PLA.
