  - o Indigenous caterers prepared traditional Indigenous meals.
    - Moose lounge and cheeks
  - Kasha attended the musical Bear Grease.
- Scraping moose hide workshop was held Quebec that Kāshā attended.
- What recommendations a best practice can we bring back to our institutions?
  - CMTN is very ahead of a lot of institutions across Canada.
  - This past year the Indigenous Scholar position is available for base funding.
  - Kāshā is thankful for our First Nations Coordinators at CMTN.
- One of the recommendations that came from the Indigenous Curriculum Specialists Network (ICSN).
  - o Support for Indigenous faculty and non-Indigenous faculty.

  - o Implement and endorse the Universities Canada's Commitments to Truth and Reconciliation and the Indigenous Education Protocol.
  - o Create community-led partnerships using proper protocols and policies.
  - Create and implement a wellness strategy for Indigenous faculty and staff.
  - Mandate experiential learning to build cultural competency and humility.
- Wise Practices
  - Understand the history of where your feet are planted.
    - Truth and Reconciliation Commission's 94 Calls to Action
    - Calls for Justice
    - Settler Colonialism

- Indian Residential Schools
- 60's Scoop
- Treaties
- Policies such as the Indian Act, etc.
- Create space for settlers to heal by exploring their four realms (emotional-heart, spiritual-soul, physical-body, intellect-mind).
- Use power and privilege as a professor to amplify Indigenous voices and perspectives in their disciplines.
- Embed heart and head work in curriculum.
- Decolonization for Leaders
  - o Model your personal commitment to decolonization.
    - Story your own journey.
    - What attitudes and beliefs did you change to get to where you are?
  - Challenge yourself to think about time as a Western construct and consider another way.
  - o Collaborate with Indigenous people at the leadership level.
    - Engage Indigenous people in policy development, strategic planning, budget decisions, and at all high-level decisions of the institution.
  - o Build authentic relationships with Indigenous colleagues.
  - o Increase the number of Indigenous hires at the leadership level.
  - o Hold commitment and re-commitment ceremonies.
    - Celebrate the institution's progress and successes in decolonization, reconciliation, and Indigenization work.
  - o Land.
    - Land acknowledgements should be the minimum requirement for everyone working in higher education.
