 Broader discussion about the requirement for both an undergraduate and a master's degree for instructor requirements, with a focus on maintaining program integrity by requiring instructors to have a foundational undergraduate education in addition to a master's degree. There was a broader discussion on whether this standard should be collected in policy, given that some institutions now allow for master's degree without a prior undergraduate degree. Discussion regarding connections between criminology and health, particularly in areas such as trauma and social determinants of health. Courses like Women in Crime that include Indigenous perspectives are cross-disciplinary and available as electives in programs like Nursing.

Discussion:	
 Bernadette shares an experience of witnessing cultural activities on campus, which sparked a conversation on the importance of genuine land acknowledgements. Titi shared a personal story of learning about cedar hat-making organized by FNACs. This hands-on experience not only involved the process of crafting the hats but also included a demonstration of cedar harvesting techniques, deepening participants' connection to the land. Through this session, they gained a better understanding of how the land shapes, guides, and connects people to nature and each other. Also, fostering a sense of unity with the land and its teachings. Helen highlighted efforts to decolonize and indigenize education through virtual discussion circle, where they engage in relational learning and discuss how to incorporate Indigenous perspectives in educational processes. Indigenization of Curriculum – Kāshā JMorris (20 minutes)	EC.24.61.02
 Kāshā is away at a conference focused on Indigenization, and no report is given in her absence. 	
Nursing CIP Codes - Darjem Ponce (10 minutes)	EC.24.61.03
 Coast Mountain College (CMTN) recently identified that its CIP codes had not been updated since 2011. With the support from IT, the Registrar's Office, and Institutional Research, CMTN utilized SIS or Colleague translation tools to update over 2,000 CIP codes, although certain programs, such as Nursing, required manual adjustments to meet ministry standards. Emphasized the importance of maintaining accurate CIP codes, given their impact on program reporting and eligibility for the Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) for international students. Suggested ongoing collaboration with faculty for specialized program updates. 	

 Shared insights from the CIRPA conference, noting that many institutions are proactively refining CIP codes accuracy.

Curriculum Workflow Update – Janice Cutanda (15 minutes)

EC.24.61.04

- Presented an update on the marketing and communications team's efforts to improve the visibility of program pages via SEO enhancements. This includes the team requesting for editor access to program pages to make updates, such as improving images, headings, adding links, adding FAQs, to optimize search engine results and improve branding and reputation. Highlighted that many program pages do not rank well on search engines, which impacts the college's ability to attract prospective students, particularly domestic ones and Gen Z who are smart in using search engines.
- The team's goal is to improve the rankings by modifying the content in collaboration with the program leads and stakeholders. They intend to improve the first paragraph of program pages, add internal links between related programs (e.g., linking diploma and post-degree diploma programs), and ensure proper keywords are included for better searchability. The team also want to create umbrella pages for related programs (e.g., nursing), which will help differentiate the programs from one another, and could serve as landing pages linking to the individual program pages.
- Helen raised concerns about ensuring departmental approval before making changes to the content, especially when it involves program-specific details.
 Reassured that the team would work closely with the departments and program leads.
- Titi suggested a potential alternative, creating a separate layer or a page that could link to the individual programs without waiting for approval processes. This would allow the team to have control over SEO efforts while still respecting the approval process for program content. Titi is happy to work and discuss it with the communications team.
- Janice will join the CIM Review Task Force, and if needed, a motion can be brought forward to EdCo later.
